- 1 Roxy Hotel**
Bring a wide lens to the atrium for multiple great shots.
- 2 Brooklyn Bridge - City Hall Subway Station**
The tiled arches here are absolutely stunning - roam around to find great angles to capture all the repeating patterns.
- 3 Fulton Street**
Try a wide shot of the spiral stairs or pay the subway fare and go shoot the lookout from the bottom level to get layers of textured circles.
- 4 The Oculus**
Move around both inside and out as there are great shots all over - take a 24mm outside and on the inside, go for the 12-16mm.
- 5 Conrad New York Downtown**
A great mix of inside and outside architecture! Atrium is fantastic, but keep an eye on the walkways on the West wall, especially around sunset.
- 6 Brookfield Place**
Between the beautiful glassed-in atrium and waterfront location, you cannot go wrong here.
- 7 Wall Street Atrium**
One of the exits of the Wall Street station puts you in this amazing public atrium with tiled pillars - try multiple areas as there are so many great shots here.
- 8 Delmonico's**
Multiple great shots at this intersection - stand across from Delmonico's to capture the unique corner of the building with the intersection in the foreground.
